





COP29 Climate Summit & COP16 Biodiversity Summit

Back to back UN summit's from mid October to mid November.

Starting in September, IEMA is running a campaign to advocate for negotiations at COP16 and COP29 to recognise the crucial role that green skills play in tackling the global climate change and biodiversity crises.

Two calls to action:

- 1. Sign our letter/petition to both new UK Government and the two COP presidents calling for green skills to be prioritised in COP negotiations. Online website and digital sign-up petition to come.
